### TNR PROGRAM

A total of 45 cats went thru the TNR program of which 9 came from the pound after it was determined that they were too unsocialized to be adopted or transferred to other rescue groups, Those 9 cats were counted in the adopted from MAR total in the pound summary and that leaves 36 cats that were trapped thru the TNR program.

### SPAY/NEUTER CERTIFICATES

Our spay/neuter program provided 6 income based certificates to pet owners in 2016 We have provided over 100 since we started offering them. The applications are available on our website

\*20 animals were actually adopted from MAR, the other 5 either changed their mind or the animal they wanted was adopted by someone else

\*\*One was denied because they wanted to adopt kittens and leave them outside instead of inside and the other was denied because they only wanted one of a bonded pair of dogs and the dog they already had was kept tied up outside

\*\*\*The 22 other applications were not completed due to the applicant adopting another animal, the animal they applied for became unavailable (adopted by someone else) or their situation changed and they no longer wanted to adopt

The average processing time from submitted to approval/denial was 9 calendar days. All applications are processed by volunteers that have full time jobs and families. Typical factors that cause delays are incomplete applications and the scheduling of home visits.
